

THE RITZ THEATRE

The Ritz Theatre once inspired a world of imagination and creativity for the Coastal Bend. Today it stands as one of the few remaining historic buildings in Corpus Christi.

Bruce Collins, a theatrical pioneer and member of the Robb and Rowley Circuit (predecessors of United Artists Theatres), built The Ritz Theatre in Corpus Christi in 1929. The Ritz was designed by St. Louis architect, W. Scott Dunne, as an "image of fantasy" using Art Deco style and Spanish Re-



naissance influences to create an atmospheric theatre palace. The elaborate interior, which seated around 1300, featured a Spanish courtyard façade and a ceiling painted like an illuminated night sky.



The Ritz's lobby was a grand, two-story, open space with a mezzanine balcony that circled the room, and featured beautiful mosaic tile and carpeted floors. 715 N. Chaparral served as The Ritz's flashy main entrance, while an additional box office and entrance faced Mesquite Street.

Opening day for The Ritz Theatre was Christmas day, 1929, and it would thrive for 60 years despite the stock market crash, and the beginning of the Great Depression. The

Ritz opened as a first-run movie theatre and vaudeville house. During World War II, big-name bands, USO performances, and vaudevillian acts entertained military personnel as well as the local community. The Ritz continued to thrive as a movie palace until the last regular scheduling of films in August 1972. It reopened as The Ritz Music Hall in 1974 and then Ritz Productions in 1976. Later, the Performing Players, an amateur theatre group, held shows at the theatre, followed by another amateur group, The Encore Theatre Corporation. The latter occupied The Ritz until the 1980's. The Ritz officially closed its doors in 1989 and has not been fully operational since.

FUN FACTS ABOUT THE RITZ

- Once labeled "the finest in the state."
- · First talking movie theatre in South Texas.
- One of the first public use buildings to be air conditioned in Corpus Christi.
- Owned by Howard Hughes when he owned the United Artist Theatre chain.
- Presidents and actors attended movie premieres at The Ritz in the 1930's and 40's.
- Most remember the venue as The Ritz Music Hall from the 70s.
- The Ritz is an atmospheric theatre with a ceiling that looks like a night sky with stars and projected clouds.
- The Ritz was donated to CCPATCH by gift deed on December 23, 2010.

WHY RESTORE THE RITZ?

- The Ritz can serve as a beacon of entertainment at the entrance to the city.
- The Ritz is one of the last historic buildings still viable for redevelopment.
- The Ritz has been and will be a city icon once again.

Reviving The Ritz will:

- · Raise property values and bring in more tax revenue to be reinvested in the city
- · Increase traffic to downtown and encourage the growth of business downtown
- · Add a new, dynamic venue to stimulate the economy
- · Inspire and support creativity and the arts

A historic theatre in a medium-size city can, per year:

- Sustain more than 177 full-time jobs
- Create more than \$5.4 million in total area expenditures
- Generate more than \$500,000 in revenue for local governments
- Add more than \$4.2 million to household incomes in the community (provided by the League of Historic American Theatres)

We are most excited about OTJ's work in Texas, particularly their restoration work on The Plaza Theatre in El Paso. The Plaza was originally built by the same architect as The Ritz, Scott Dunn. We have few resources showing the original details in The Ritz and will look to The Plaza restoration to give clues on how to bring The Ritz back to it's 1929 glory.



OTJ's first phase will start in the next few months and includes completing a building assessment, conceptual master planning, and cost estimating. Under the direction of Gary Martinez, OTJ has already secured team leads and we will be looking to add local professionals under this leadership team!



IMMEDIATE FUNDING NEEDS

CCPATCH is seeking \$500,000 as seed funding to kick off the first phase of the revitalization of the historic Ritz Theatre.

The first \$230,000 in donations will be doubled because of another grant we have received from the National Park Service and Texas Historical Commission related to past hurricane damage. The "Harvey grant" is to be used specifically on repair to the exterior of the building that was damaged by hurricane Harvey and this grant is time sensitive (must complete, pay for the work, and submit receipts for reimbursement by March 31, 2024).

\$500,000 will pay for:

- OTJ's first phases:
 - Building assessment and hiring the pro team
 - · Conceptual master planning
 - Cost estimating
 - Final plan submission

- Completing the exterior work identified in the THC grant:
 - · Embedded steel repairs
 - Patch and seal cracks in brick veneer
 - Waterproofing exterior


Other immediate work needed:

- · Doors, windows, and access
- · Fire, safety, and security



RECENT WINS FOR THE RITZ


- Hired Executive Director, Cheryl Votzmeyer-Rios
